

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JUAN BAUTISTA AUTHORIZING STREET CLOSURE ASSOCIATED WITH THE CENTRAL COAST FARMER'S MARKET

BE IT RESOLVED that, subject to the conditions listed immediately below, Juan Carlos Gonzales of Promociones Jalisco (Operator) are authorized to close Washington Street between Second and Fourth Streets (without closure of Third Street) from 9:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. on SUNDAY, MARCH 21 only; and subject to the conditions listed immediately below.

BE IT RESOLVED that, on subsequent Sundays through April 25, 2010, the Operator is authorized to close Washington Street between Second and Third Streets only for the Central Coast Farmers Market,

BE IT RESOLVED that, on April 20, 2010, the City Council will again consider a road closure resolution for subsequent closure of Washington Street between Second and Third Streets.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following conditions are prescribed:

CONDITIONS – MARCH 21, 2010 - SPECIAL EVENT:

1. Washington Street between Second and Fourth - Third Street to remain open;
2. 9:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m.;
3. 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 PM set-up and tear down;
4. In addition to farm products, this event will include the following food items: churros, kettle corn, corn on the cob, fresh fruit waters, and for this special event only, traditional Mexican food;
5. This event will include live music;
6. The San Juan Bautista community events form stipulates that payment of \$100 to the City for each event in the case of minor street closures is required. A payment of \$100 shall be made no later than March 18. Failure to make payments to the City shall be cause for negating the approval of the farmer's market and this resolution;
7. Portable, freestanding signs shall state "Farmer's Market – Sundays" with the hours of operation included. Five of these signs will be permitted to be put in place in the City on Sunday mornings and shall be removed at 3:30 p.m. immediately after the event. Location of signs subject to approval of City staff;
8. The Washington Street City right-of-way will be cleaned of trash at the end of each event;
9. Six sets of trash barrels will be provided to accommodate all recyclables in separate containers from non-recyclable trash. The operator shall bear all costs

- related to collection and disposal of recyclables and non-recyclables per state law. Recycling shall be enforced by the Operator;
10. Sidewalks, where they occur, shall be kept clear;
 11. All vendors shall have current City business licenses and shall pay a business license fee; and
 12. Event organizer and vendors shall abide by all state, county and city laws.

CONDITIONS –SUNDAYS (commencing with Sunday, March 28, 2010 through April 25, 2010 only).

1. **Because of other approved events, the FARMER’S MARKET WILL NOT OPERATE ON WASHINGTON STREET ON THE FOLLOWING DATES: April 18. So as to allow continuum of the Central Coast Farmer’s Market this resolution for street closure will allow the Farmer’s Market to be operated at another location as approved by the City Manager and the April 17/18 Jeff Williams Arts and Crafts Festival;**
2. In addition to farm products, this event will include the following food items only: churros, kettle corn, corn on the cob, fresh fruit waters;
3. The San Juan Bautista community events form stipulates that payment of \$100 to the City is required for each event in the case of minor street closures. Payment in advance shall be made on the first day of each month. A payment of \$200 shall be made for Sunday, March 21 and 28 by no later than March 18. All subsequent payments shall be made on the first day of each month. Failure to make payments to the City shall be cause for negating the approval of the farmer’s market and this resolution;
4. Portable, freestanding signs shall state “Farmer’s Market – Sundays” with the hours of operation included. Five of these signs will be permitted to be put in place in the City on Sunday mornings and shall be removed at 3:30 p.m. Location of signs subject to approval of City staff. If it is the intent of the Operator to design and construct a permanent sign to advertise this event, the Operator will submit a sign application to the City Planner with plans and proposed permanent location;
5. The Washington Street City right-of-way will be cleaned of trash at the end of each event;
6. Two sets of trash barrels will be provided to accommodate all recyclables in separate containers from non-recyclable trash. The operator shall bear all costs related to collection and disposal of recyclables and non-recyclables per state law. Recycling shall be enforced by the Operator;
7. All vendors shall have current City business licenses and shall pay a business license fee; and
8. Event organizer and vendors shall abide by all state, county and city laws.
9. This resolution for street closure is applicable on Sundays from March 28 through April 25;
10. Continuation of the Farmer’s Market past April 25 will require that the City Council consider a new resolution for road closure on April 20, 2010.
